## DAY SIX assumptions

Injustice happens when people view one another differently than God does, when we refuse to acknowledge that every person who has ever walked or will ever walk on this planet was created in the image of God. Sometimes we look at things in this world and jump to conclusions. We believe stereotypes instead of learning the facts about an individual. Sadly, this just fuels injustice.

To act justly means to see people as God does. In all likelihood, that means you'll have to change the way you think about some things (Rom. 12:2). Are you up for that challenge?

Consider the following crises. What do you know about these situations? What do you assume about the people involved? How do you think God views the people suffering these injustices? How does your thinking need to change in order for you to act justly?
